## RV Rules and Regulations 07/19/2022

- Check In is 3:00 PM and Check Out is 11:00 AM
- Reservation must be paid in full at time of booking.
- Reservations can be made one year to the date in advance. Reservations for holiday/event weekends should be made at least 3 months in advance.
- Sites can only be booked for a max of 90 nights per site.
- Reservation dates may be changed once online after the original reservation.
  After that please contact Campground staff.
- Minimum age to rent a site is 19 years. A responsible adult must check in and occupy the site during the entire reservation. Failure to do so will result in eviction and forfeiture of all payments.
- A nonpermanent structure is allowed on a site with an RV, for storage use only.
- Only 2 vehicles allowed per site, and they must remain in reserved site.
- Campers must provide their own camping equipment suitable for the location, subject to Campground Manager's approval. A camping permit is required before setting up camp. It is mandatory to have a camping unit before registering. Site changes are not allowed.
- Proof of registration must be available upon request of Campground Staff.
- Registered guest only after 10:30 PM all guests not staying in the campground need to leave before 10:00 PM.
- Pets are welcome but MUST BE always ON A LEASH no longer than 6 feet. Do not leave pets outside unattended. PLEASE PICK UP AFTER YOUR PETS.
- It is unlawful to hunt, trap, pursue, catch, or kill any wild bird or wild animal in Live Oak. Please keep your distance from all wildlife. Remember, on the trail's wildlife have the right of way.

- Draining water, soap, grease, or any other waste product onto the ground or into anything other than an approved holding tank, sewage receptacles, or dump station is a violation of State Law.
- Electric scooters, Mopeds, Minibikes, Motorcycles, Motor Scooters, Go-Carts, Golf Carts, and any other type of motorized vehicle is not allowed to be in the campground unless it is a licensed vehicle. Only licensed drivers and licensed vehicles can utilize park roads. Registered and licensed golf carts are allowed but must be driven by a licensed driver. This does not limit the use of equipment to assist handicapped people.
- Campers may bring their own fire pit if it is at least six inches off the ground.
- Pick up downed wood only for campfires. No cutting of trees, branches, or bushes is allowed. Cut up any wood used for campfires, so it is contained within the fire pit and is not on the ground. No chainsaws allowed in the park.
- Deposit trash in dumpsters. Household trash should not be put in the garbage cans at other park facilities.
- It is illegal to have open alcohol containers in a motor vehicle in the State of Alabama. Public intoxication will not be tolerated at Live Oak.
- Quiet Hours are enforced from 10:00 PM until 6:00 AM.

## **Facilities Rules and Regulations**

- The Baldwin County Commission has the authority to shut the event down if any of the following occur:
  - o a. Defacing the facilities and/or amenities in any way
  - o b. Unruly/Disorderly behavior by guests
  - o c. Uncontrollable/Unattended children
  - o d. Fighting
  - o e. Illegal Drug Use
- THERE WILL BE NO REFUNDS IF EVENT IS SHUT DOWN.
- It is illegal to have open alcohol containers in a motor vehicle in the State of Alabama. Public intoxication will not be tolerated at Bicentennial Park.
- Deposit trash in cans. Household trash should not be put in the garbage cans at other park facilities.
- Any person or persons caught damaging or defacing any part of the pavilion or grounds or amenities will be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law.
- Picnic tables are to be returned to their original location if moved.
- Any decorations hung on pavilion or rafters must be removed before leaving including strings and attachments.
- Silly string, glass bottles, confetti, shaving cream, glitter and dry rice are prohibited.

- The Interpretive Center furnishings and displays are not to be moved from their location. Tables and chairs may only be used within the building and on the porches and patio.
- No nails, tacks, brackets, or self-adhesive tape will be allowed on or in walls, ceilings, floors, or any material that will deface, mar, or damage a finished surface.
